ARKANSAS SCHOOL FOR THE BLIND AND VISUALLY IMPAIRED
ARKANSAS SCHOOL FOR THE DEAF

The Board of Trustees for the Arkansas School for the Blind and Visually Impaired and the Arkansas School for the Deaf met for their monthly meeting May 16, 2023, at the Arkansas School for the Blind and Visually Impaired.

Statement of Intent IDEA Part B -

Mr. Caton provided summary for Statement of Intent Part B. This is an annual statement of intent that is submitted along with the application for 6B Funds and Preschool funds. The letter states that the school will comply with assurances surrounding the federal funds.

Board Co-Op Resolution –

Dr. Dickinson provided a summary for Board Co-Op Resolution. This is related to house bill 1192 becoming ACT 802 2023. The Board must make a resolution stating who will represent on the Co-Op Board. Traditionally, each Superintendent has maintained that role. ASD Co-Op is Arkansas River and ASBVI is Arch Ford.

Discussion Items

Dr. Ivy Pfeffer, Department of Education –

Dr. Pfeffer, AR Department of Education, is one of the Deputy Commissioners. Over the past few months worked with both superintendents to learn about the schools, work, and challenges to be a further support for them. Recognized one teacher from both schools as a high impact teacher this week and last. New things coming, new opportunities for education in Arkansas. Secretary Oliva describes it as building an instructional house. New, much clearer, and focused, academics standards will be taught by teachers next school year and new assessments that will be more aligned to the new standards. The standards are the floor, and the assessment is the roof of the instructional house that together will be built. The Board of Trustees and Secretary will work together to make crucial decisions and give support to each Superintendent to make the decisions that need to be made for their school. Currently working towards increasing teacher salaries at ASD and ASBVI. Also, want to continue having conversations about facilities. Both campuses are beautiful, but they have some challenges. Plans to return over the next year and continue conversations about ADE supporting and making great things happen.

ASD Community and Shared Services

ASD community asked for clarification on who runs the school for the Deaf? ASD or Board of Trustees? Mrs. Pack stated that ADE wants to get to the point where the schools make their decisions, while ADE certainly has their approval of things, but the school makes its own decisions and not micromanaged. Several additional members expressed their appreciation and gratitude to Dr. Janet Dickinson for years of hard work and all that she has done for the School for the Deaf. Additionally, the community expressed concerns about the safety for both campuses and encouraged the board to make decisions for improved safety. Mrs. Pack assured the community members that the issues of safety have been discussed with ADE and everyone wants the best for both schools. There are a lot of things to look at and think about.

Mrs. Pack stated there will be an interim Superintendent for ASD. Encourage staff to submit concerns and ideas to their supervisor, for submission to the Board of Trustees no later than next Monday.
